Sunrise Park Bear Award

Sunrise has an award for students that exemplify White Bear Lake School's "Core Values" of compassion, integrity, respect, responsibility and service. The Bear Award will be given each spring to students who meet the following criteria:

- Students must not have any discipline referrals during the current year.
- Students must be on the "A" or "B" honor roll 1st, 2nd and 3rd quarter of the current year.
- Students must volunteer in a community service activity during the current school year with service hours *being more than a one-time activity*. An adult in charge of the activity must sign the application.
- Students must submit an essay explaining how they have demonstrated compassion and integrity during the current year.
- Students must submit an application along with their essay in order to be considered for the award.



Sunrise considers the Bear award to be one of the highest accomplishments any middle school student can attain.



8th Grade College Visit

Parents of 8th graders, it's time to sign your student up for a college visit. Sign up soon in FeePay so your child doesn't miss this amazing opportunity! Students may only sign up for one visit.

Drop Off & Pick Up

Help us keep children safe. Please DO NOT drop off/pick up on the Cedar side of the building during these times: 7:45 - 8:15 am and 2:45 - 3:15 pm. This creates a dangerous situation as students walk from behind a bus down the side in between the buses when the buses are pulling in and out of the loading zone. Bus drivers have major blind spots all around the buses, and despite their best efforts, they cannot always see students.

Parents may drop off/pick up students on the east (Jay Lane) and west (Door B and C parking lot) sides of the building during these times.

Staying After School

Students are only permitted to stay after school to participate in a supervised after school activity or to work with a teacher. Students may <u>not</u> stay after school to do homework or hang out with friends, as these activities are not supervised. FLEX is free after school option for students, Monday - Thursday. Although there is currently a waiting list, parents are encouraged to register their children, as students are added regularly. FLEX

FLEX is a free after school program at Central and Sunrise Park Middle School. The program includes a variety of opportunities for students, including academic support, recreation time, clubs, and service opportunities. Clubs are teacher-led as well as youth-generated. The program runs Monday-Thursday after school only. Students can take the activity bus home, walk, or be picked up by a guardian. All students must be registered for the program.
