Here is some information about how distance learning will work:

Distance Learning Components

- Daily announcements will be sent to students by their teachers, including a to-do list, through Google Classroom or Schoology by 10:00 A.M.
- Teachers will post daily office hours and email/phone contact information in Google Classroom. Teachers will be available via Google Hangouts Meet, email or telephone between;
 - 10:00 am 12:00 pm
 - 1:00 pm 3:00 pm

<u>Attendance</u>

- Students are expected to participate daily, however, they can choose the time within a day to complete tasks.
- Attendance will be taken based on student participation (posting in a discussion, submitting an assignment, responding to a prompt, etc.)

Student Workload

- In order to accommodate student schedules and at-home responsibilities, students will be expected to complete less work that would normally be expected if they were attending in person.
- Typically work that is completed at home takes two to three times longer to finish. Teachers are taking this into account as they plan their lessons.

<u>Grades</u>

- Teachers will continue to follow the grading system used prior to transitioning to distance learning.
- Teachers will post announcements with information on what students need to complete and submit.
- Students are expected to participate in and submit assignments for each class.
- Quarter 3 will still end as scheduled, but students will have until April 9 to complete and submit any late-work, missed assignments, etc. Due to this extension of time, report cards will be delayed until later in April.
