The voting entrance is Door I (on the north side of the building). Parking is available on the north, east and west sides of the building. The voting area is not accessible to/from the rest of the school building. Use Door A for regular school business.

Polls will be open on Nov. 5, 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Your polling location is determined by where you live and may be different from previous elections. Visit <u>www.mnvotes.org</u> or call 651-407-7563 to find your location.

The decision for November 5, 2019 to be scheduled as a No School Staff Professional Development Day was made when the calendar committee was creating the 2019-20 calendar approved by the School Board on December 10, 2018. The decision was made in response to parents and community members who expressed safety and security concerns related to the potential for the mixing of community visitors and students in those buildings throughout the district that serve as polling locations during elections.
